
Training here ensures exposure to varied traffic conditions without the hassles, congestion and costly delays experienced in larger cities.

How long will it take?

This really depends on you, your personal schedule and how you adapt to the helicopter and/or the theory.

Your course & training times are as flexible as you need to them to be. You may want to attend full time or part time, it's really up to you.

Training full time could take you anywhere from five to twelve months. Training part time may take longer. How often you wish to train is entirely up to you. As stated before, our school is extremely flexible and able to cater to your specific needs.

Generally, every lesson involves a preflight briefing, followed by a post flight inspection & discussion.

The amount of effort you put into your training will also reflect how long it takes. We will provide you with the highest quality instruction in a superb learning environment; however, it is you who needs to be prepared to put in the hard yards for your exams and flight training. By putting in the effort, you will reap the rewards.
